Please take this opportunity to have your say and submit your completed questionnaire to any member of the Parish Council by January 1st 2021.





It is wonderful to know that 100 children will benefit because of your kindness.

Rectory Ramblings

Is the end really in sight now?

I write as news of a 90% effective Covid vaccine has been announced ... although it hasn't yet been approved, nor practicalities of its distribution (at super low temperatures) worked through.

OUR HOPES ARE BEING RAISED, in temporal terms, and I truly hope these hopes will come through. But what then?

I often heard people say they want to get back to 'how things used to be'. It seems we've developed a nostalgia for pre-Covid, forgetting its frustrations and appreciating more now than we did then!

But is 'how things used to be' the limit of our ambition?
For in truth our world is messed up, with or without Covid.
Yes, there is beauty, there is fun, and there is satisfaction. But they do not last...And suffering and death remain. No vaccination, technological breakthrough, new leader, or societal change will make all

We humans cannot sort ourselves out. If it was up to us, the only 'end in sight' would be a catastrophe too big for us to survive.

BUT THERE IS A BETTER HOPE for us - 100% certain.

The end is in sight, that is the message of ADVENT (the 4 weeks before Christmas), but the end of what?

Advent is when Christian's focus on Jesus' second coming. His first coming 2000 years ago gave us a snapshot of what is to come as Jesus showed He has power over disease, nature, evil spirits, and death.

As Jesus travelled to the Cross (where His apparent defeat was in fact victory and rescue) He gave glimpses of the 'all things made new' world that He will bring when He returns. It will be a world which has seen the END of conflict, death, tears, sadness, and fear. A world where selfishness, greed, self-hatred, and distrust of God will no longer spoil God's blessings, or be a barrier to joy and worship and contentment. That is a Hope to bring joy to our hearts

So 'Come on Vaccine' but even more 'Come back Lord Jesus !'

Lord God, fill my heart with the **better hope** of what is to come for all of us who trust in Jesus. Fix my eyes on Him this Christmas. Amen
