Lock-down

At the start of lock-down, the Chapel was able to join Beaumont Parish Council and St Mary's Church Beaumont in offering a telephone help-line and assistance to Parishioners with medicine delivery, shopping etc. Due to our Active Church project being "on hold", we have kept in touch with young people and their families in the Parish on a couple of occasions. We are particularly grateful to the young people who made colourful drawings for the Parish notice-boards.

During the time of lock-down, even though the Chapel building has been closed, members have been in constant touch with one another and have tried to keep friendly contact with those known to us facing various difficulties. The weekly news sheet continues to be e-mailed to members and is posted onto the Parish web-site. Like others, we have been forced to adapt and encouraged to do things in a new way such as taking part in services and meetings on Zoom or listening on Facebook or by telephone. As well as the weekly Sunday morning service prepared by the North Cumbria Methodist Circuit, we have been able to experience a wide range of different services on offer out there and listen at times convenient to us. As time has gone by, more opportunities have been developed by the Circuit, enabling us to take part in various on-line activities helping members and others we can connect with, feel less isolated. Details are posted on the North Cumbria Methodist Circuit Facebook page.

However, as a Circuit, we are conscious that not everyone, especially those perhaps in the older age-group, is able to participate in this new style of Church so every Church/Chapel is discussing individually how best they can offer "Church" in future whilst following current Covid guidelines.

Deacon Mel Beavan and husband Glyn from the manse at Crindledyke have now left the Circuit for Mel's post at Queen's Foundation, Birmingham and her replacement Deacon Mark Attwood, and his wife Christina, from East Anglia have arrived at Crindledyke to start work in the new post of Circuit Mission Enabler. We look forward to working with Mark in his new role.

Re-opening of Chapel

Members of Monkhill Chapel, together with Minister David Newlove, have decided to re-open the Chapel from Sunday 6th September for a shortened, informal Sunday Service lasting approx.30 mins. Seats will be allocated on arrival and the wearing of face masks/coverings is mandatory in the building. The service will proceed in line with Covid regulations. Rectory Ramblings

Should we do what the government say?

Do I have to keep the speed limit? 'I can drive this road perfectly safely at least 10 mph faster.' Do I really have to wear a face mask and social distance? 'I didn't for the rest of the life and I've been fine!' Do I need to get a vaccine when/if one is available? ... Must I pay taxes & not take cash payments I don't declare?...

In his meaty letter to the Christians in Rome Paul wrote this:

"Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. ² Consequently, whoever rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves.... ⁴ For the one in authority is God's servant for your good... it is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also as a matter of conscience. ⁶ This is also why you pay taxes, for the authorities are God's servants, who give their full time to governing. ⁷ Give to everyone what you owe them: if you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honour, then honour."

Romans 13 verses 1-7

Remember that the authorities he was talking about were persecuting Christians & yet he says they are established by God and used by Him. God is the God of order not chaos, of respect not personal autonomy. Governments are not perfect, they don't get everything right. But disregarding and disobeying them is something a Christian should only do if it goes directly against God's clear commands. Otherwise we are called to honour and obey, even if we disagree or dislike it, and even if those around us are doing differently. So let us honour God in this.

Lord God, I like to think I know best, and so pick & choose the rules I keep. Help me to recognise that as arrogance, and honour you. Amen
