The experiences of a dog walker

My name is Lynne, you may already know me as I have lived in Beaumont all my life. If you don't, I walk a lemon roan cocker spaniel, Bertie; you may have seen us out and about. Bertie is our son's dog, he's 8 and has lived with us for 4 years after coming to us originally for a 2 week holiday! I knew nothing about keeping a dog; we had a cat at home as I grew up which was adopted from a neighbour. I was bitten by a farm dog in the village when I was primary school age so was always very wary of dogs especially large ones. However I quickly learned to look after and love Bertie which will come as no surprise to other dog owners. He is amusing, good company and keeps us fit!

Now I think dogs are only as good as their owners. We spoil Bertie, our "grand-dog", and then wonder why he's not always obedient — our fault! He loves to be outside and is always eager to go "walkies" and being a typical spaniel, spends as much time sniffing as walking! He knows where other dogs have been by their scent and also where other dogs "have been" if you know what I mean!

Which brings me to the subject of dog poo – perfectly natural for dogs to poo when out for a walk but unnatural for them to pick it up themselves which is where dog owners come in useful!

Why have a dog, invest money and time in them, feed and exercise them, take them to the vets if poorly, wash them if dirty or even take them to the groomers, but not "pick up" after they poo. This is not only failing the dog, but failing the owner and others. I find dog poo all over the place when walking in our Parish, even near to the children's play area at the Parish Hall and it's along every road I walk. Even dog poo on the grass verges which I feel is not acceptable because country roads often have no pavements so people have to walk on the verges to avoid traffic.

Due to lockdown people are restricted to walking in their own local area, so this dog poo must be from local dogs and owners who, for whatever reason, appear to ignore the rules.

Some time ago, if my memory serves me well, a young lady living in the village developed an eye infection and nearly lost her sight due to a virus caused by dog dirt. This could potentially happen to any of us at any time, dog owner or otherwise, and the sensible thing to do is to minimise the risk.

The trouble is that all dog owners are unfairly placed under suspicion of not "picking up", who really knows? It must be the anonymity making the few act in this way as they can easily get away with it.

So I will try to appeal to their better nature. We live in and around an area of outstanding natural beauty and are fortunate to have some lovely, peaceful countryside walks. Have you noticed the lovely poems printed on posters around the Parish, courtesy of Kirkandrews-on-Eden W.I., for people to read on their daily walks and to enhance mood in this difficult time. A true kindliness shown to others. Please follow this example and be kind and considerate of others. The pandemic and tragic outcomes so many people are experiencing must teach us this. It's not a perfect world but if everyone played their small part, it could be considerably better for us all.

Let's try to keep our villages clean and tidy for local people and the tourists who will come back when allowed, to enjoy the countryside and all it has to offer, hopefully free of dirt and litter.

Now on the subject of litter----don't get me started!!!!!

News from Monkhill Methodist Church

Lockdown and the resultant Chapel closure means there is much less to do and report on than usual. However, members felt there must be something we could do as a Church to help the community in some way during this pandemic and struck upon the idea of donating a computer to a school pupil, who otherwise would have no means of doing their school work on-line from home.

We were able to source and fund a refurbished computer locally and a second computer was donated by an individual member, resulting in 2 computers going to a primary school in our own local area. So are so pleased to have been able to help in this way.

In the last Parish Magazine, we reported on plans to form a larger "North Cumbria" Circuit by joining with the Wigton Circuit although the potential name of any new Circuit would have to be decided jointly. We may be a step nearer after our Circuit meetings towards the end of February so any update will be given next magazine.

We remember those who have been bereaved recently, those in hospital or who have been in hospital, those whose treatments have been delayed or postponed and we continue to pray for all affected by Covid, both directly and indirectly, many known to us personally. We remember and acknowledge that throughout the pandemic "God is with us".

The following quote by John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, has been taken from the North Cumbria Methodist Circuit Facebook page and is as relevant today as it was then –

"Do all the good you can,
By all the means you can,
In all the ways you can,
In all the places you can,
At all the times you can,
To all the people you can,
As long as ever you can"

Rectory Ramblings

I write this as the Prime Minister lays out his roadmap for our next few months – schools returning, phased re-openings etc. The worst is over, it would seem. We are coming down the back of the second wave, and spring is starting to give us a feeling of new life, even new hope. I am reminded of the line 'strength for today, and bright hope for tomorrow, blessings all mine and ten thousand beside' from the hymn 'Great is thy faithfulness O God my Father' – for it is His gifts that enabled the vaccine development, and His help that will keep us going.

In the psychological terminology of 'Disaster relief' we are now in Phase 2. We have had the initial (often adrenalin fuelled) **Response** (to the crisis), now we are beginning **Recovery**, and over the next few years there will be **Rebuilding**.

The Recovery phase is the 'picking up the pieces' – structurally, as well as mentally/emotionally/spiritually – as we process and integrate what has happened. This is the time to focus on our mental health, so that we can go forward healthily into the Rebuilding phase.

As part of our Pastoral Care to you we've included in this magazine a straightforward worksheet entitled 'My Pandemic Experience' to help each of us reflect as part of our 'Recovery' processing. It works best when you give time to ponder each part...

We're also engaging emotionally with God in our Online Lent services using the Psalms (bible songs and poetry) which express all kinds of emotions from situations of struggle, and draw us further into a wholistic, lived faith, not just an intellectual one. Why not join us... and/or make contact if you'd value a listening ear and a prayer?

This prayer comes from Psalm 25 vs4-5&21...

Show me your ways, Lord, teach me your paths. Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Saviour, and my hope is in you all day long. May integrity and uprightness protect me, because my hope, Lord, is in you. Amen

FOUNDATIONS – Episode 1

Many of us are re-evaluating how we see the world, what our expectations are, and what we're building our lives on. I've been asked to add to our Parish Magazines an accessible, non-topical series on the real Foundations/building blocks of the Christian faith.

Why go back to the start? For many of us these 'basics' were knowledge our (grand) parent's generation assumed but never really articulated/passed on to us properly. So much of what we know is 2nd hand opinion, with knowledge gaps we are embarrassed to ask about!

Let's begin with Why am I like I am? Why are humans as we are?

Why are we:

individual and communal?

similar yet distinct?

creative and purposeful?

grounded and yet imaginative?

finite but seeking eternity?

The Bible's answer is that we are <u>created</u> beings made in the <u>image</u> of the eternal trinitarian God. **We're 'matter' that matters!**

- CREATED Deliberately formed from 'the dust of the earth' the same ingredients as the rest of creation we're not self-created or meaningless, & our purpose & fulfilment come from our Creator.
- IMAGE God breathed His divine 'life' into us and we reflect our maker in our nature, far more than any animal, plant or planet.
- etternal God has always been and always will be, and His divine reflection in us means we know ending/death is not good.
- TRINITARIAN Because God is 3 persons in 1 God: a tri-unity of perfect love between Father, Son & Spirit. So we're distinct individuals who flourish in relationship with God & each other.

MY PANDEMIC EXPERIENCE



The pandemic has impacted us all. This guide helps you to reflect on your personal experience. Try to find a quiet place, and around 30 minutes, to use the questions and underlined <u>links</u> to explore what has been going on for you. You can either print the sheet off, or type in the white areas by clicking in them.

THANKSGIVING

What are you thankful for? Think about small daily things, such as food, as well as bigger wider things, such as frontline workers.

Thanksgiving is becoming increasingly popular as a mental wellbeing tool People struggling with their mental health are often encouraged to keep a gratitude diary, writing down three or more things each day that make them feel grateful. Even on the hardest days. The reports are that it proves very helpful. For Christians, thanksgiving is part of our regular practice. We believe that God is listening to us with delight as we give thanks for all the gifts he has given, just as a parent delights in watching a child enjoy food or toys or play or learning.

PRACTICES

 Keep a gratitude list or jar. Write down three things each night you are grateful for from the day.

There is much over the last year to be sad about. To lament is to describe all that sadness. We might talk about it, make a piece of art about it (whether we're 'good' at painting or drawing or not). We might sing sad songs or make scrapbooks or photobooks to remember people by. We might need to cry or walk or exercise or light a candle in memory. Lament is woven through the Christian tradition. In the middle of the Bible you may have on a shelf, there is the book of Psalms, which are ancient songs to God. Some of them are hugely helpful at expressing our sadness and anger and lament. For example, Psalm 42 involves honest recollection of how we are feeling, and a passionate expression to God of the pain and difficulty that we are experiencing.

PRACTICES

- Read aloud <u>Psalm 42</u> every day until you have expressed all the lament, or listen to this song.
- You might also want to write your own list or poem about how you feel and read that aloud

LAMENT

What are you missing, longing for? This may be people or things you have lost, hopes that have been dashed or longings for a better future.

LEARNING

What have you learned? What have you learned about your life, about what and who is important to you, about how you want to use your life well? What do you want do differently as a result of the pandemic? The Bible is full of people finding God helping them in the midst of the muddles and difficulties and challenges of life. Pain and suffering have always been part of life, and Christians, like everyone else, want to make sense of them. That's not always possible, but it can be possible to find God with us in the dark places of life. Jesus said 1_am the light of the world', and countless people around the world have found that to be true – that his light shines in the darkest places when we give ourselves to him. You may like to read a poem on this theme.

PRACTICES

- Write or draw in a notebook for a few moments several times a week to help you reflect on your life and think things through. After a few weeks, it can be helpful to look back and see how things are going.
- Talk through your experiences of the pandemic good and bad – with someone you trust, Invite them to ask questions and to listen carefully. Sometimes it's in talking with someone else that things become clearer. If you don't have anyone, contact a <u>church</u>.

Many people pray – people of all faiths and none. In a crisis we long to know that there is someone bigger than us who can help us, so we cry out, hoping there is a God who is loving and who is listening. Christians believe that praying is not just for emergencies. We believe that the whole of life is meant to be a conversation with God. Jesus lived like that and his friends wanted to learn to live like that too. So Jesus gave them what we call The Lord's Prayer. If you've never prayed regularly before, it's a great starting place. You could read the prayer every day, thinking about each bit. And then ask God for help for other things and other people. You might also want to find out more about praying. Christians also find it helpful to pray and worship together, rather than trying only to get to know God by ourselves. Ask a Christian you know how to join in some praying at church either online or in a meeting.

PRACTICES

- Ask a Christian you know if they pray, and how they pray. Ask them what difference it makes to their life.
- Maybe find or <u>buy</u> a <u>Bible</u> or a <u>Bible app</u>, and start reading one of the accounts of Jesus' life, for example the section in the <u>Bible</u> called <u>Mark</u>. Make sure you find a <u>modern-language</u> <u>version</u> of the <u>Bible</u> that is easy to understand.

PRAYER

What would it be good to think about in your praying over the coming weeks? People, situations, and concerns - local and global.

FURTHER RESOURCES

- If you have experienced the death of a loved one through this time you may find this informative online booklet on <u>Death, Grief and Hope</u> helpful, or these resources from <u>MIND</u> on bereavement.
- If you would like further help, find a <u>Church near you</u> and make contact. You'll be warmly welcomed.




