Rectory Ramblings

I wonder how often you've heard people talk about everything getting <u>'back to normal'</u>? In a time of change & uncertainty it's natural to want to go back to the safety of what we know... but I wonder if we are falling into the sentimental fiction of *'the way things used to be'*.

At times of struggle in the present we look back and remember with rose tinted spectacles what we did have [or look forward optimistically to what we hope to have] as an antidote to what we don't have now! But at no time in our past were we every actually fully content ... and in this life we won't be in the future either.

As I see it, things will never go back fully to how they were. The soonest we can hope for full vaccinations is a year or two, until when there will be restrictions. By then we'll have worked out (and settled into the habit of) new ways to live that blend old and new.

It may help to look at many of the lockdown changes not as an anomaly, but an acceleration of change that was likely to happen anyway. Someone told me that many industries were forced to do 7 years worth of change in 7 days – home-working, online retail etc.

As a Church, the delivery of Online services, Assemblies, and Pre-School resources have in the past been 'ideas to be explored when we have time' ... yet they are the normal now as we share the joy-giving knowledge of God who is never surprised, and is always with His beloved children. Gathering physically is a very important part of being a Christian, and we will do that as we can, but where we gather and organise our structures may well be different from before.

Christianity has survived and thrived down the ages (and will continue to) because we face changes in style and context with openness and confidence ... for 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever' [Hebrews 13:8] & He is making all things new ©

Lord God, I so easily rely on temporary things rather than on your unfailing goodness and mercy. Please help me get a better grasp of your greatness, and so be freed to face change with confidence. Amen

METHODIST NEWS

Latest updates

To confirm that Methodist Churches nationally will not be re-opening at present. The Methodist Conference this year will be taking place virtually between 25 June and 2 July and a decision will be made at the Conference about their re-opening. It is envisaged at this stage they will be opening for individual and private prayer only but further information & advice will be available in due course. Look out for details on the Chapel board and Parish Notice boards.

Revd David Newlove, our Superintendent Minister, has been on sabbatical since 15 April and is due back 16 July. During his time away, his aim was to reflect on the Cumbrian rural community and context, reading books and preparing material for celebration and worship throughout the agricultural year in order to develop a pattern of ministry and mission to rural North Cumbria and the Agricultural Chaplaincy. In his down time, he will be tinkering with the tractor in his garage!

All this, assuming he has not been called in to assist at the hospital (where he is a Chaplain) dependent on the path of the virus.

We are loosing our 2 Deacons this year as they move on; Sarah McDowall to the Southend & Leigh Circuit and Mel Beavan to the Queens Foundation in Birmingham where she will be involved in Deacon training. Dcn Mark Attwood from East Anglia will be replacing Mel wef 1 September in the post of Mission Enabler. We have already met Mark and his wife at Monkhill one Sunday morning during their first brief visit to the Circuit and we look forward to working with Mark in September.

Activities on hold

All our planned activities are still on hold until further notice advises otherwise.
