#### The Bowness Bells

The Bowness Bells have a story behind them! Have a look at the back of the Church where there is an information sheet which tells you about them. They are old bells, and one of them has the date 1616 on it. In2016 it will be 400 years old! Can you find the bell with the date on it?

### A Church Mouse?



A phrase you sometimes hear is that someone is "as poor as a Church Mouse". St Mary's has a carved mouse, but where? This is hard to find! It is a mouse that has been carved into something inside the Church that is oak.

Stained Glass

Many Churches have lots of stained glass. Many years ago, when, hardly anyone could read the glass was used to help people remember stories from the Bible. Some of the windows in St Mary's are quite old but others are more recent. With Bowness being by the sea, it is perhaps not surprising that stories from the Bible which feature the sea or fish can be found in the glass.
